Since 1997 he has worked for the Døgnkontakten/Etnisk consultant team, and since 1999 he has served as an ethnic consultant for the City of Copenhagen. In 2006 he made his debut as a children's book author, and in 2007 he published the second book in his series about Iqbal Farooq.

His published books include: *When Love Becomes Coercion — Generational Conflicts and Arranged Marriages* (2003); *Iqbal Farooq — And the Black Pierrot* (2006); *How to Avoid Dropouts, from A to Z* (2006); *Iqbal Farooq — And the Crown Jewels* (2007); *Iqbal Farooq — And the Indian Super Chip* (2009); and *Clumsy Hassan*, the title of which is a reference to the Hans Christian Andersen fairy tale *Clumsy Hans*.
